State Denies City's Ability to Nominate **Pratt-Pullman Yard for Historic Protection**

On Aug. 15, 2016, the Atlanta City Council unanimously adopted legislation seeking historic nomination for the buildings located in the Pratt-Pullman Yard. In keeping with that legislation, the city's Urban Design Commission sent a notice of intent to nominate the Pullman Yard for landmark buildings/site status to the Georgia Building Authority (GBA), who owns the property on behalf of the state of Georgia.

Unfortunately, the GBA's legal counsel sent a letter to the city stating that the state "does not acknowledge the City's legal authority to nominate the property for historic or landmark designation." Consequently, the Urban Design Commission pulled the item from its Nov. 9 agenda.

The state has preempted the city in its efforts to mark this site as landmark or historic, but that does not mean that we should stop advocating for the preservation of these buildings. Mayor Kasim Reed, the state of Georgia, and the larger community are all aware that the residents of Kirkwood want to have the buildings that are located on this site protected and preserved. And any future developer must be made aware of this fact.

Councilmember Natalyn Archibong is dedicated to this issue. She is working with the city's planning commissioner

Students Explore Biodiversity at Hawk Hollow

This November, the Wylde Center education staff was thrilled to welcome students from 4/5 Academy at Fifth Avenue to its Kirkwood greenspace, Hawk Hollow. Over the course of a week, every 4th grade class enjoyed a walking field trip to the site and participated in an environmental science program exploring biodiversity, including both native and invasive species in the area. These species are being rehabilitated with a focus on restoring native plant life.

Students took a guided hike through the woods to not only observe the devastating effect that invasive plant life can have on the Hawk Hollow ecosystem, but to also see how the ecosystem heals through the hard work of site coordinator Tamara Jones and



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The students explored native plant and animal life by playing "biodiversity bingo" and through a study where they compared the variety of plant and animal life in two very different areas of the space.

The children discovered several examples of animal life, like salamanders, wooly bear caterpillars, a garter snake, and a brown decay snake that someone found at least once a day. They also played a version of flag tag that demonstrated how introducing just a few invasive species can drastically diminish the biodiversity of an area.

Both the students and Wylde Center staff had a lot of fun with this program. It was a great chance for these young ones to get outside, explore their neighborhood, learn concrete ways that they can support the overall health of their world, and have an engaging educational experience beyond the walls of their classrooms.

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Take a Battle Tour to Ring in the New Year

On Dec. 31, take a break from the holiday hubbub and go on a walking tour through an important piece of American history right here in our neighborhood. It's an easy stroll along the Union Army's front lines and in the surrounding area where the Confederates tried for a surprise attack.



This monument near East Atlanta, (decorated for Christmas) marks the place where Union Maj. Gen. James Birdseye McPherson, the highest ranking army commander in the Civil War, was killed during the Battle of Atlanta on July 22, 1864. You may know the outcome, but on this tour you'll find out how it happened and learn about the men who fought and died on a very hot day in July of 1864. Hear about the interesting history of this unique part of Atlanta from before and after the Civil War.

The tour starts at 11:00 AM in front of the coffee shop at the corner of Flat Shoals Avenue and Glenwood Avenue SE. It takes about an hour and a half, so you'll have plenty of time to enjoy the tour and even brunch or lunch in

the Kirkwood or East Atlanta villages before ringing in the New Year later that evening. Advance tickets are required, available on the BATL website (see below).

Two more upcoming tours bring variety to the organization's schedule.

On Jan. 21, they're offering their popular Bicycle Tour of the Battlefield, a easy guided expedition on an 8-mile route visiting various sites. You'll need your own bike and helmet. Purchase tickets by Jan. 19.

In February, they are planning a Saturday woodsy hike to the Terry Mill Run, which played an important part in the Battle of Atlanta. The details are still being fleshed out and the date will be announced on their website.
