MARTA Hopes to Attract More "Lifestyle" Riders with Expanded Tiered Bus Service Plan

Currently, MARTA operates two distinct tiers of service: rail and local bus. But there's a significant gap between them. The 2016 Comprehensive Operations Analysis seeks to fill it by expanding the levels of bus service. The goal is to attract more riders from "lifestyle" transit markets using a five-tier approach, as explained in more detail below.

First, MARTA envisions **arterial rapid transit** (ART) as a network of frequent routes on existing high-density arterial corridors where residents will likely respond positively to enhanced service. It will bridge the gap between the speed of rail and the convenience of a local bus.

ART routes will have at least six buses per hour, further spaced stops (which will allow buses to travel faster), signal priority, queue jump lanes at intersections, and dedicated lanes. Off-board fare collection, level platform boarding, and all-door boarding will decrease time at stops.

Similar to rail, ART routes will serve as principal network spines. Corridors selected will feature linear alignments with higher densities of residents, retail, and jobs.

Second, **express** routes are long-distance trips that utilize freeways and metro Atlanta's growing network of high occupancy toll (HOT) lanes to provide fast connections between park-and-ride lots and transit centers to employment destinations or rail stations.

The express tier serves a variety of purposes from simple point-to-point commutes to longer distance rapid transit. Routes with greater all-day demand offer connections to intersecting transit services. GRTA is an example of existing express service.

Third, **frequent local** routes will focus on corridors that support buses arriving at a stop at least every 15 minutes all day. They will use 40' buses, along major corridors.

Along with rail and ART, this tier completes the Frequent Network, envisioned as a "collection of transit services that consumers can use spontaneously, without consulting a




schedule and planning their arrival at the stop/station. This level of convenience is important in developing a constituency of transit passengers that can feel comfortable using the transit network rather than just individual stops."

Fourth, supporting local routes make up the majority of the network. They will provide connections to places like employment centers, transit centers, and activity centers. They're the lifeline to transitdependent residents, while also providing connections to the Frequent Network.

Supporting local routes will have buses every 30-60 minutes, depending on usage. Additional peak-period buses could be added to routes that show strong support.

This is the type of service MARTA buses have historically focused on to provide connections to rail stations. Under the COA, supporting local routes will offer access to a far broader Frequent Network than rail service alone.

Lastly, community circulators are shorter-distance local routes that connect residents to community retail, education, and transit stations. This service will be different from supporting local because it will use smaller or specially branded buses.



MARTA's 2016 Comprehensive Operations Analysis wants to increase the types of bus service to improve transit usage.





How Toddlers Learn Music

For both children and adults, it's easier to learn new things when they relate directly to something in our lives. We tend to be great learners when what we're learning is meaningful to us. In educational jargon, this concept is called "meaningful context." It's one of the basic strategies teachers use to motivate students to learn.

Think about a teacher you loved who made the subject matter "come alive." That teacher probably did something to make the topic meaningful to you, knowing that if you found a personal connection to the material, you'd be naturally inclined to learn more about it.

The same idea applies to learning music. Young children don't start out familiar enough with music to be able to find special meaning in the melody, harmony, or meter used in a song. But if you sing a song about a child's best friends, favorite animals, or special events in their lives, they will quickly "tune in" to the music and want more!


We also retain information better when it's accompanied by movement. And physical movement relates to the rhythmic feeling in music. So using movement activities with music has the advantage of not only applying the meaningful context concept, but capitalizing on movement as a way to




