

time for me as well," he said. "But I really wanted to run in Atlanta — go to brunch with my friends afterwards, sleep in my own bed."

Most of his training miles were in and around Kirkwood, "usually having a Dulce Vegan scone on my way out the door for fuel. I tried to run with the runners and walkers group as much as possible, adding on extra miles before or after the group run if necessary. For my longer training runs, I would set out water and electrolytes on my porch and do loops around the neighborhood."

David says Kirkwood is a

great place to run because there are so many parks and other runners to wave at along the way. "One of my longest runs was the day of the Kirkwood Lanta Gras Parade. It was cold that morning, but there was a real energy in the neighborhood. It really helped."

Another thing that helped him was a new yoga class for runners at Indigo Yoga on Hosea Williams Drive. "I had been having problems with stiffness in my hips, and this class really focuses on all the problem areas runners have," David said. "Awilda, the instructor, is great.



She always comes to class prepared, and the class really flows. We've started to have a nice group of regulars."

When marathon day finally arrived on March 20, the Kirkwood Runners and Walkers group set up on College Avenue by FitWit. "It really helped to see so many of my friends out to cheer me on at mile 11," he said. "It gave me a boost."

Then, "Sonya met me at mile 16 near Emory University with more support. By mile 25, I really started to fade, but I met up with the 4-hour pace team led by former Kirkwood resident and Kirkwood group runner Charlie Holder," David said. "I knew as long as I stayed with Charlie, I would finish in under 4 hours, which I did ... barely."

And afterward? "We all went to brunch at Elmyriachi and toasted everyone who ran that day, including Todd Bowers who ran the Publix Half Marathon. Then I got to sleep in my own bed." Which just happens to be a handmade bed frame that he and Sonya bought off the Kirkwood Yard Sale page a




Middle School


