

In Search of Our Feathered Neighbors

Sixteen adventurous Kirkwood neighbors - including two young girls equipped with awesome, neon-colored binoculars - joined me on the morning of Sunday, May 21, for the Spring Fling Bird Stroll. This was the second year for the event and, in spite of the rainy weather, twice as many people strolled the tree-lined streets and parks of Kirkwood to learn about the birds they've seen and heard - as well as to hopefully glimpse some new ones.

The number of species in Kirkwood varies throughout the year as many different ones cycle through Georgia with spring and fall migrations, and summer residents in addition to our permanent residents. We managed to identify 27 different species of birds. Had we been out longer and covered other areas, we might have seen and heard many others. That's the nature of birding,

though.

We were treated to good looks at common species like northern cardinal, American robin, blue jay, northern mockingbird, eastern bluebird, and European starling. We also witnessed nature in action when a blue jay and northern mockingbird chased and dive-bombed an American crow in Bessie Branham Park, all while chimney swifts twittered above.

Did you know that we have two different species of crows living in Kirkwood? They look virtually identical. In fact, the only way you can tell the difference between the American crow and the fish crow is to hear their calls. We saw and heard both. We also heard two different wren species currently in Kirkwood.

The Carolina wren (the state bird of South Carolina)

Now Is When to Do Something About Property Taxes

The DeKalb County Tax Assessor's Office will mail 2017 annual notices of assessment on June 2. And many of Atlanta's intown neighborhoods will experience significant increases in their property values, which result in higher property taxes.

In my 25 years in the property tax business, one thing holds true: People want to be treated fairly and equitably, and we all just want to pay our fair share. Whether your value went up, down, or stayed the same, I recommend that you file an appeal.

Here's why.

The Tax Assessor's Office uses a mass appraisal approach in order to value properties in the county. This means that they're using all of the sales in a neighborhood in order to value all of the homes in that neighborhood. Because Kirkwood is a complex and diverse neighborhood where each home is unique, the mass appraisal approach often produces values that are neither fair nor equitable. If your value stayed the same as last year – or even went down – don't assume that it's accurate.

The assessment notice not only informs the property owner of the taxable value of their property, but it also provides the property owner the right to appeal their value. Homeowners may file an appeal on the following grounds:

- Value: You feel that your value is too high based on comparable sales.
- Uniformity: You feel that your property is not being valued in a fair and equitable manner in comparison to your neighbors.
- **Taxability**: You feel that your property should be exempt from


paying property taxes. This usually doesn't apply to homeowners.


• **Denial of Homestead Exemption**: You filed for but didn't receive a Homestead Exemption.

There are other benefits to appealing your property value, but you should know how to navigate the appeal process in order to benefit fully. I've found the employees at the Tax Assessor's Office to be very friendly and helpful, but mass appraising Atlanta's intown neighborhoods is a difficult and challenging task.

The appeal deadline is approaching, so don't miss the chance to exercise your right to a fair valuation.

Battlefield-Inspired Art Exhibit in East Atlanta

In conjunction with this year's commemoration of the Battle of Atlanta, the Friends of East Atlanta Library will host works from artist Jeff Beekman's "Battlefield" series. The photographs were mostly taken on the battlefields at Gettysburg at night and then combined through projections with other historical images found in research by the artist. The result is striking.

The Florida State University professor is a multidisciplinary artist whose work since the early 2000s has explored the interrelationships between land, memory, and human activity. More recently, Jeff has been looking at the history of U.S. Colored Troop units in Civil War battlefield sites and how the efforts and sacrifices of black soldiers are specifically memorialized.

The display will be up through July 22, the anniversary of the Battle of Atlanta. There will also be a tour as well as wreathlaying ceremonies at two monuments.





Focus on your progress, not your slip-ups – for slip-ups there will inevitably be.



When I catch people who are working out with me saying things like, "Look at all this fat just hanging here ...", I nip that damaging talk in the bud.


Uh-uh, not while you are working out. Not while you are right now – at this moment – working very hard to make yourself better! Move on, next moment, focus on your progress.

It includes the site where a leading general was killed, the point where the Battle of Atlanta began, as well as the site of the first desegregation in Georgia. is a year-round neighborhood regular. This very industrious little brown bird has a big "voice." You'll often see it on or near the ground, or searching every crack and crevice of your house as it forages for spiders and other insects. They're also fond of peanut butter and apple slices, so you might try putting some out and watch what happens – if the squirrels don't get to the snack first.

The house wren is a summer visitor whose song is a gurgling outburst of beautiful trills and flutelike notes. There are several reliable locations in Kirkwood where you can find this exuberant little bird singing.

We ended our stroll at Kirkwood Feed & Seed to check out their bird-oriented supplies and fill out a checklist of the birds we identified. Thom and his staff provided refreshments.

There were lots of great questions, and I believe the 2017 Spring Fling Bird Stroll was a fun and educational experience for everyone that participated! If you missed out, don't worry: You won't have to wait until next year. Watch for announcements of more Kirkwood bird strolls.
