

## Kirkwood Bark Park? New Committee Formed

Kirkwood's four-legged residents (the canine variety) may soon have a park to call their own. After several years of fits and starts, the Special Committee to Explore a Dog Park in Kirkwood has been recognized and is moving forward on site selection.

The goal of the commit-

tee is simple: To establish a well-maintained park with a minimal negative environmental impact that serves dog owners and non-dogowning residents alike.

It may not surprise you to learn that a large number of families in Kirkwood have searched hard for an off-leash

area that's walkable from their homes. The committee's difficulty, of course, is identifying an appropriate plot.

Criteria for dog parks, while somewhat flexible, make site selection challenging. You can review the City of Atlanta DPRCA guideline document at https:// www.atlantaga.gov/home/ showdocument?id=7741.

Long-time Kirkwood resident Wayne Carey noted that a dog park in the right place could capture and preserve greenspace that would be a gem for residents in the future as development booms. Committee member Ryan Marosy said that traffic from a dog park reduces crime in underutilized spaces, making it a benefit to non-dog owners as well.

The committee members discussed their plans with Teaniese Davis, president of the Kirkwood Neighbors' Organization, and asked to be formally established in June. What the new committee now needs is more hands and input from neighbors. If you would like to participate, please come to the next committee meeting.

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## Former Doctor Combines Medicine with Meditation

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
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## Local Theater Brings Timely Topics to Stage

Pinch 'N' Ouch Theatre is staging David Mamet's play Glengarry Glen Ross through September 23.

If you're looking for a different night out in the neighborhood, consider checking out a performance of *Glengarry Glen Ross* at Pinch 'N' Ouch Theatre. Located just down the street from the soccer field on Arizona Avenue, this intimate theater is a hip hang that makes a great evening out for friends or business networking.

Producing Artistic Director Grant McGowen wears two hats with this show, serving as both the director and an actor in one of the two casts of the play. He acknowledges that the David Mamet script is "certainly a bucket list play for all of us, because it's really visceral stuff." He says it also feels right for the moment, given its comedic view on the dark side of the American dream. Audience members may be familiar with the 1992 film version, starring Al Pacino, Jack Lemmon, and Alec Baldwin, among others. The story centers on a group of real estate salesmen whose mantra "Always be closing" leads the quest for cash above all else.

As with all things Mamet, it's peppered generously with profanity, so it's not really intended for children.

Fans of *The Walking Dead* will be excited to see actor Jayson Warner Smith (Gavin) take center stage in this production. McGowen says that Smith "brings something original and unique to his role, that's far from Mr. Pacino's interpretation."

If you're looking for a great pre- or post-show drink spot, you can head right across the street to Ration & Dram, where you're likely to run into members of the cast!

Pinch 'N' Ouch also has acting classes, where McGowen offers instruction for both stage and screen. "I teach art, first and foremost, not business. It's a great way to learn about yourselves, others, get a grasp on human psychology, and develop empathy. I think everyone should learn this stuff," he says.

"It's rigorous work," he admits. "I think people are always surprised how difficult it is, but when they really dig deep, commit themselves, and *practice*, the sky is the limit."



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## Updates on City of Atlanta Taxes and Trees

Single-family property owners in Atlanta-DeKalb will see a 20% reduction in their 2017 property assessments as a result of the July 6 vote by the DeKalb County Board of Assessors.

The Board's actions are governed by state law O.C.G.A. 48-5-299(d). DeKalb County was obligated to lower property values to be consistent with what was approved by Fulton County. The law, in fact, specifically provides that when a city is located within two different counties, those two counties must confer and distribute city taxes uniformly.

Two things to note: First,

the decrease in valuation did *not* extend the deadline for filing an appeal of your assessed value – that has passed. Second, the decrease only impacts the City of Atlanta and Atlanta Public Schools taxes. The taxes for DeKalb County services will be based on the full assessed value.

Councilmember Natalyn Archibong was the chief sponsor of legislation to establish a 180-day moratorium on the cutting of 10 or more trees located on 5 or more acres. It's a companion to the legislation adopted by the City Council in December 2016 that authorized the use of a portion of the City Tree Trust Fund for the purpose of acquiring forested land.

The new moratorium allows the city to continue evaluating acquiring select forested acreage without fear that these forested lands will be clear-cut during the deliberation process.

She also sponsored affirming the city's support for the Paris Climate Accord, which prompts Atlanta to take the lead in encouraging other cities and businesses to continue and to expand efforts to protect our environment.
