

Cookout Block Party Celebrates Local "Legends"

Carrie Cook and Thelma Favors, ages 89 and 96 respectively, have led remarkable lives. Two of the five children born to the Welch family in Paulding County in the 1920s, they recall sorting potatoes at a clearinghouse and picking a hundred pounds of cotton a day for a single dollar's wage. Their father, a sharecropper, farmed a field for half of the crop, a system known as "working the halves."

After they moved to Kirkwood in the middle of the century, the sisters walked up and down Sycamore Street for miles, cleaning houses along the way.

Now you're likely to see "the Welch Sisters" joyriding around their neighborhood, enjoying the fresh air and living out their mantra, "You are as young as you feel." On Sunday, September 3, many will gather at the third annual Hometown Country Cookout block party on Wisteria Way to honor the Welch sisters (who were also honored in 2015) along with 10 others who have extraordinarily deep roots in our community, including:

- Cassie Edwards, 92
- Willie Mae Hardy, 109
- Louise Lavonia Hall Robinson, 101
 These individuals have lived in
 Kirkwood for more than 50 years and
 have extraordinary insight into the
 history of the neighborhood. The event
 seeks to honor their legacies and give
 others the opportunity to learn from
 their wisdom.

The Hometown Country Cookout is an event organized by Mother's Legacy Foundation, a local non-profit founded by sisters Alleah and Ayana Salone in honor of their grandmother, Leila Johnson. In addition to its mission of honoring local "legends," the organization hopes to raise money for school supplies for local children and develop young entrepreneurs. Drew Charter School's InvenTeam will also attend.

The event, sponsored by the Coca-Cola Company and the Kirkwood Neighbors' Organization among others, will also feature a sweet potato pie competition, a mac & cheese competition, and barbeque by local grillmasters.

Over 250 people attended in 2015, and the organization hopes for even greater attendance this year.

Teaching Kids Home Security Starts with Practice

In your home, real security begins with awareness.

As adults, we are all too aware of safety in our homes, but when did we gain that awareness? In my house, we started working on security when the kids started school.

Encourage your child to lock the door each time they enter or leave the house. That way, it will become routine.

Make it a ritual for you and your child to lock up the house each night. Teach them to check whether windows are closed and locked as well.

Model smart home security yourself. Demonstrate the safest way to respond to unexpected situations. Don't open the door without checking to see who it is first. Speak *through* the door to an unexpected visitor. Check the credentials of service providers.

You know your kids are watching because you've got the (usually embarrassing) stories to prove it! When you show them safe and sensible routines, they'll mimic those, too.

Beyond your immediate security, keep an eye on the street and the neighborhood, and talk about your concerns if you see suspicious behavior. Show your kids what you see. Teach them to notice what you notice. They'll learn to be good citizens through you.

Wendlo Release Party for Engagement Party EP at Taproom Coffee



The band Wendlo, featuring Jacob and Chelsea Hamilton, will perform a blend of acoustic-electronic sounds and expressive melodies at their EP release party.

Jacob Hamilton, 27, has been playing music for more than half his life, while his wife Chelsea, 22, started performing about 5 years ago after Jacob convinced her to sing with him at a wedding.

Wendlo – "old new" spelled backward – is "a bit of a wordplay that reflects our personality," Jacob explains. "Chelsea and I have a wide range of musical influences, so we aren't married to one particular style or another. Our biggest hope is that we can use music as a vehicle to connect with people."

Chelsea, a barista at Taproom, says she and her husband aim to "always write from the heart." This mantra yields the honest sound in Wendlo's first EP, *Engagement Party*. Fans of Grouplove and Oh Wonder will hear influences of both bands in Wendlo's music, while others may catch impressions of The Weepies or Bob Dylan.

Wendlo will be supported at the show by two other local acts: Freddy Castro and Isaiah Ram.

"We're so excited to get to play for people right here in our community," Chelsea says. "So come out, grab a drink, and enjoy a night of music with us in the heart of Kirkwood. We can't wait!"
