

# Kirkwood Facebook groups support residents

Two Facebook groups – Kirkwood Cares and Kirkwood Warm Meals – have joined forces to help provide housing repairs and food assistance to neighborhood residents in need.

Kirkwood Cares was initiated by Rob Osbon and Stan Sugarman with the aim of having a seamless and accountable way to support neighborhood repairs through the Kirkwood Neighbors' Organization. Justin Schaeffer says he "jumped at the opportunity to be a part" of the group after he was told about it.

"We started Kirkwood Cares because we believe there is economic, social, and spiritual value to living in a socioeconomically, culturally, and racially diverse neighborhood," Schaeffer said. "Unchecked, the market forces will continue to displace our low-income neighbors, and we are in danger of losing the diversity that makes Kirkwood such a special place to live."

So far, Kirkwood Cares has fixed a sewer line, restoring use of toilets and

drains to a home, and it brought a hot water heater closet up to code in order to replace a warrantied water heater, giving hot water to three senior residents who'd been without it for eight days.

One project was identified by a neighbor, and a fundraiser brought in \$1,300.

Although the group has a small budget from KNO and has additionally raised about \$3,000, Schaeffer said financial support remains the group's biggest need. "We'd love it if neighbors signed up to be monthly donors in order to build an ongoing stream of support. We have 18 houses total on our list right now, and the work – as it stands – will be in the many tens of thousands."

The group can also use volunteer help with administrative tasks, communications, fundraising, and product management. It's actively seeking connections with vendors who might be able to do donated or discounted work in exchange for promotion, sponsorship acknowledgment, and a special place on the Kirkwood Neighbors Facebook group's home recommendations document. Enter the Kirkwood Warm Meals group, created in 2017 by Ashley Hayes and modeled on the Oakhurst Warm Meals group. Hayes admins the group along with Lisa Kagan and Meagan Potts Weinzierl. It's aimed at providing warm meals to Kirkwood residents who have a short- or long-term need and are not already receiving any meal service.

Projects have included assisting the family of a long-time resident diagnosed with cancer as well as a family with a premature baby in NICU.

When Hayes, who also admins the Kirkwood Neighbors Facebook page, found out about Kirkwood Cares, she immediately saw an opportunity to fill a need and reached out to Schaeffer.

Now, Kirkwood Cares asks on its intake forms whether residents need food assistance. If so, the Kirkwood Warm Meals group will reach out to finalize details and set up a meal train for residents.

# 7 Best Practices for Determining ... "What's My Home Worth?"

- 1. **Do your homework and consult with a hyperlocal career Realtor** who transacts a high volume of homes in your neighborhood.
- 2. To provide exceptional accuracy, the Realtor must visit your home, look at your land, home finishes, assess the home's systems and even poke his/her head in your crawl space or attic. Otherwise, you can likely expect to have issues when selling to include delays in closing or notable post-inspection obstacles. Your realtor should be more than a sales agent and should know homes very well. It's also an asset if your Realtor has a background in home building.
- 3. **Review the area's market assessment** provided by the Realtor. Look at each home as a comparable to help you lock in your home's value.
- 4. Look at the current "Active Market" of competition. Your Realtor should be able to provide you with this. Your "current" competition will help you further dial in where your home sits on the active market "now."
- 5. Visit your competitors' homes. Yes, you can do this! Your realtor won't mind in fact, they should encourage it. A good Realtor knows how important it is to set the correct price from the beginning.
- 6. **Don't build in too much negotiation room**. If your home is "market ready," price it at the top of market range, but not so high you simply won't get views or offers. All buyers use "Search" gateways (usually in \$25k increments) to view homes online first. If your price is initially set too high, you will miss an entire pool of buyers and or simply not get the viewings.
- 7. Pricing a home isn't a "set-and-forget" procedure. Have a plan for when your home comes to market to ensure it moves in a timely manner (ideally, anywhere from two to six weeks, depending on your personal hyper-focused market).

# Deadbolts: The difference in door locks

The deadbolt, a locking mechanism separate from the doorknob, is a critical component of door security. There are, in fact, three grades. Grade 3 is the builder standard for residential dwellings. Grade 2 is for light- to mediumcommercial use. Grade 1 is heavy duty.

The better – and more expensive – ones are engineered to withstand the various ways thieves try to thwart a lock.

For example, basic deadbolts are two halves held together with two bolts that thread from the inside half into the exterior half. If you tap the exterior deadbolt face (which is just a thin sheet

Rain barrel workshops of metal) with a hammer, you can see the dimples where the attachment bolts terminate. Drill into those dimples, and the twisting action of the bit will back the bolts out – and the lock will fall right off the door.

Locksmiths do this when they can't pick the lock.

I've tested and evaluated most of the locks on the market in search of the most secure, mid-priced residential deadbolt.

Inexpensive, lightweight locks bend when force is applied, and they're easily compromised when hit with a hammer, torqued with a pipe wrench, drilled, or "bumped."

High-security locks like Medeco and

MultiLock cost \$200 or more.

The Grade 2 deadbolts I trust most are Kwikset's UltraMax lock (780 series) and Schlage's B560 series. Locksmiths also have a Grade 2 from Locksmiths Distributors of America (LSDA).

Single-cylinder deadbolts require a key from the outside but have a twist knob on the interior. Double-cylinder deadbolts require a key on both sides. These are more secure, but they can make it harder to exit quickly in case of a fire.

# Toilet rebates

The City of Atlanta Department of Watershed Management is offering \$100 credits for the purchase and installation of toilets designated as 1.28 gallons per flush. To be eligible, you must own or rent a singlefamily home built before 1993 and be current customers in good standing. To receive the credit, you must have a receipt for a toilet that will replace one with a higher flow (1.6 gallons or more per flush) and agree to installation inspection and verification.

You're allowed two rebates for two toilets. Approvals take 2-3 months, and rebates follow two billing cycles later.

# Sharing the road safely: Bicycles are vehicles, too

According to state code, all laws that apply to motor vehicles also apply to bicycles (except for the penalties associated with DUI and a few other laws). That means that bicycles are required

to follow all of the "rules of the road," and in turn, motorists should treat them as any other vehicle, large or small.

That being said, bicycles do have some specific laws that govern their operation on the road, and motor vehicles have some laws that govern their operation around bicycles.

Bicycles must ride as far to the right side of the road as is practical – so not when turning left or avoiding hazards, when the lane is too narrow to share safely with a motor vehicle, when



traveling at the same speed as traffic, or while exercising due care when passing. They cannot ride more than two abreast in a single lane and must ride in a lane having



the same direction as other traffic. And if a bicycle lane exists, they must use it.

Drivers must yield to any bicyclist inside a bicycle lane. And they cannot "overtake or pass" a bicycle (going in the same direction) unless they can do so while leaving "a safe distance between such vehicle" – 3 feet on all sides – and returning to their lane before an oncoming vehicle gets within 200 feet.
