"We saw an opportunity and we took it," says Adam Cole, co-director of the Grant Park Academy of the Arts. "Even though the greater Grant Park area is full of artists and musicians, no one had established a place where students could study the arts in the neighborhood. With the expansion of the area coming as a result of the Beltline, we knew we could either be first or wish we had tried harder."

And so a partnership was born between two veteran musicians and long-time Grant Park residents. Cole, a twelve-year veteran of the Fulton County and Atlanta Public School systems and an author with Royal Fireworks Press, was looking for a way to expand his existing

### Changes at Toomer: Moving forward in many ways

Hello, Kirkwoodians! There's lots of growth happening in education and transportation here.

Toomer has a new principal, Caroline Brown. She is a very experienced educator and school leader with APS who has lived in Georgia since she was small child. She has been a principal at Burgess Elementary and most recently at the Barack and Michelle Obama Elementary School. She's known as a "no excuses" leader who excels with hands-on leadership and a focus on the Common Core.

Her goal is to align teaching well with the CCRPI testing subjects so that Toomer can continue to prepare students for success at the middle and high school levels. Brown also wants to improve outreach to our Edgewood neighbors and continue to involve both our neighborhoods as well as East Lake in building a strong school.

Toomer is also getting closer to its International Baccalaureate designation, led by Kaitie Clark, formerly of Decatur City Schools. We are all excited to see the fusion of social-emotional learning from IB and how it will dovetail with Principal Brown's vision for preparing better for CCRPI.

Brown had a meet-andgreet at the PTA meeting on

Nov. 14, where she conveyed confidence, warmth, a passion for teaching, and hands-on leadership. She was also introduced with the new assistant principal, Teruko Dobashi-Taylor. Taylor has numerous responsibilities as Brown's right hand, but she expressed that one of her passions is restorative practices and disrupting the school-to-prison pipeline.

Both leaders are excited and committed to the school, hopefully for several years to come.

Winter and spring will be a busy time for Toomer PTA. The spaghetti dinner - a huge community event open to all and our largest fundraiser - and Valentine's Day dances are in February. Toomer will also have a float at Lanta Gras this year. We are thrilled to have a larger presence at the parade, which is quickly becoming a neighborhood favorite.

The KNO transportation, education, and parks committees have continued to advocate for a PATH spur from the Trolley Trail to Edgewood Court Apartments (ECA). This appears to be dovetailing nicely with upcoming Trolley Line Trail work and renovations at ECA. Residents of ECA, parents at Toomer Elementary, and Organized Neighbors of Edgewood have all shown strong support for the project, and I will continue to try to move the project forward.

The City of Atlanta's new Chief Bicycle Officer (aka "Bike Czar") Cary Bearn, has also been instrumental in trying to rally these groups and to smooth the PATH, so to speak.

Speaking of bikes, Neil Davis, SOPO Bike Cooperative board member and Toomer parent, coordinated Toomer's 2nd Grade Bike Parade. He secured lights, T-shirts (courtesy of Kaptain Kirk Clothing), and helmets for all of Toomer's 2nd-graders. Students got to ride and learn safety skills, and everyone learned more about alternative commuting. Participating bike shops and organizations included Atlanta Bicycle Coalition, Atlanta Department of City Planning, Aztec Cycles, Civil Bikes, Georgia Bikes, Georgia Commute Options, Relay Bikes, Safe Routes to Schools, Santa United, and Melanie Sharon with face painting.

It's been an exciting year to be a part of education in our neighborhood.

music school, the Adam Cole School of Music. Katherine Moore, a long-time employee of The Music Class, wanted to return to her roots as a vocal pedagogue.

Moore also had a vision for homeschool offerings in the neighborhood. "I was taking my daughter all the way to Tucker for hybrid homeschool classes," she says. "I couldn't understand why, with all the homeschoolers we have in our neighborhood, there weren't more opportunities here. Then I thought, 'Why can't we do that?""

Other offerings one would expect from a community arts center are available at GPAA as well, including summer camps and afterschool enrichment.

Cole and Moore spent the fall and winter of 2017 establishing a partnership with Park Avenue Baptist Church. The church, looking for a way to increase its community outreach, was more than happy to let them renovate space formerly occupied by the Girl Scouts. And so, with the help of their families, the two began

cleaning and painting.

Since then, the third floor has hosted summer camps, masterclasses, open houses, even a family jam with special guests from local bands. Enrollment is up, and with their continued outreach, GPAA is quickly becoming known as the community's arts hub.

"Get Arts Centered' – that's our motto," Moore says. "It represents everything we are and want to do." Cole adds, "We're not interested in weeding out the kids in the neighborhood who are going to be the next great musicians. We want to teach everyone to think like musicians, because musicians think like scientists, like mathematicians, like successful business people."

It's this integrated approach to the arts, a bringing out of the person through arts education, that differentiates GPAA from other schools in nearby neighborhoods. Rather than ask what their students can do for the arts, Cole and Moore ask what the arts can do for their students. Their answer? Increased capacity to think clearly, to engage, to take risks, and to succeed.

Music instruction, for both kids and adults, currently covers piano, voice, guitar, woodwinds, and violin, with other instruments to come. Homeschool and after-school offerings include yoga, both STEM and STEAM, magic, visual arts, and a social awareness/community service class called Camp Freedom.

They are looking for more ideas, too. "We want to know what the community needs," Moore says, "so we can bring it."
